

To Attach the Stand to the TV

Turn the TV upside down and rest on a soft, sturdy surface. [Caution: Never lay this TV face down on the screen]. Insert pedestal base into TV bottom and align the screw holes. Use the magnetic screwdriver included with the accessories, and place each screw on the end of the screwdriver as shown in Fig. 5a, then insert the screws into each of the screw holes in the bottom of the hole in the TV Stand (Fig. 5b) and tighten the screws using the screwdriver. Do not over tighten.

Remote Instructions



• Remove battery cover.




• Insert 2 "AAA" batteries.



Replace cover.

- Effective remote range is approximately 30 ft. at an angle of no greater than 30° left / right or 20° up / down.
- If the remote will be unused for an extended period of time, remove the batteries.



- Do not expose remote to liquids, direct sunlight, or excessive heat.
- The IR receiver will not work properly if the set is in direct sunlight.

Remote Control

- 1. POWER Turns TV on / off Standby.
- 2. **DISPLAY** Provides current program information.
- 3. Pause.
- 4. Previous.
- **5.** Next.
- **6.** - Stop.
- 7. REP Repeat.
- 8. CH.LIST Displays list of saved channels.
- 9. **GUIDE** Displays scheduled programming for current channel.
- 10. FAV Displays favorite channels.
- **11. FREEZE** Freeze current image. (Press again to unfreeze)
- **12. PICTURE** Select from preset picture modes: Dynamic > Standard > Movie > User.
- **13. TEMP -** Select the color temperature COOL > NORMAL > WARM.
- **14.** ▼▲ ◆ ► **ARROWS / ENTER** Moves through menu options. Press **ENTER** to confirm selection.
- **15. EXIT** Exits displayed menu.
- **16. RETURN** Returns to previous menu.
- **17. SLEEP** Press to activate the sleep function. The TV will automatically turn off after: 15 > 30 > 60 > 90 > 120 (minutes) > OFF.
- **18. MENU** Displays the main menu.
- 19. ASPECT Selects viewable display aspect: Normal, Wide, Cinema or Full.
- 20. VOLUME (+/-) Adjusts volume.
- **21. LAST** Switches between current and previous channel.
- **22. MUTE** Mutes volume (Press again to restore volume) .
- **23. CHANNEL △** / **▼** Changes channel.
- **24. NUMBERS / DASH -** Selects desired channel. For example, to select digital channel 4 1, press buttons " **4** " " " " **1** "
- 25. INPUT Displays input sources.
- **26. AUDIO** Selects from preset audio modes: Standard > Soft > User > Dynamic.
- 27. MTS Programs second audio channel (if available) .
- **28. CCD** Displays closed captions (if available) . Press again to turn off.

Setting up an antenna or basic cable service with a coaxial connection

Antenna:

Connect coaxial cable from antenna to "RF" on TV. (Shown below)

Basic Cable Service:

Connect coaxial cable from wall jack to "RF" on TV. (Shown below)

Auto Channel Search


Press **MENU**.

Scroll right ▶ to highlight "Channel", then press **ENTER**.

Scroll down ▼ to "Auto Channel Search", then press **ENTER**.

*NOTE: The menu will automatically disappear if you don't make a selection within 8 seconds.

The auto search will automatically detect and store local analog and digital channels. A full auto scan can take up to 10 minutes. If you want to exit the auto search at any time, press RETURN 3 times. *NOTE: If you do not run a full scan the TV will not find channels.



Connecting a cable/satellite box, DVD player, or game console with a composite connection

- 1. Connect A/V cables to TV. (Figure 1a)
- 2. Connect A/V cables to peripheral device. (Figure 1b)
- 3. Turn on the TV and peripheral device.
- 4. Finally select the correct input:

Press INPUT.

Press the arrow buttons (▲ ▼) to highlight "AV".

Press ENTER.

*NOTE: If you select the wrong input, the TV will display a blue "No Signal" screen. If the device is off, the TV will also show "No Signal".



Connecting a cable/satellite box, DVD player, or game console with a component connection


- 1. Connect component video cables to TV. (Figure 1a)
- 2. Connect RCA audio cables to TV. (Figure 1b)
- 3. Connect component video cables to peripheral device. (Figure 1c)
- 4. Connect RCA audio cables to device. (Figure 1d)
- 5. Finally select the correct input:

Press **INPUT**

Use the arrow buttons (▲ ▼) to highlight "Y Pb Pr"

Press ENTER.

*NOTE: If you select the wrong input the TV will display a blue "No Signal" screen. If the peripheral device is off, the TV will also show "No Signal".



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
Connecting a cable/satellite box, DVD player, or game console with an HDMI connection

- 1. Connect HDMI cable to the TV. (Figure 1a)
- 2. Connect HDMI cable to peripheral device. (Figure 1b)
- 3. Finally select the correct input:

Press **INPUT**.

Use the arrow buttons ($\blacktriangle \blacktriangledown$) to highlight the correct HDMI port. (HDMI 1, 2, or 3) Press **ENTER**.

*NOTE: If you select the wrong input the TV will display a blue "No Signal" screen. If the peripheral device is off, the TV will also show "No Signal".



Most commonly labeled "Line Out" or "A/V Out" or "Output"

Connecting a computer with a VGA connection


- Connect VGA and 3.5mm audio cable to the TV. (Figure 1a)
 Connect VGA and 3.5mm audio cable to the computer. (Figure 1b)
- 3. Finally select the correct input:

Press **INPUT**.

Use the arrow buttons (▲ ▼) to highlight "VGA"

Press **ENTER**.

*NOTE: If you select the wrong input the TV will display a blue "No Signal" screen. If the peripheral device is off, the TV will also show "No Signal".



Initial Setup Menu

Press ▲ ▼ to choose desired function. Press **ENTER** or ▶ to adjust or enter a submenu.



Menu Language

Press the left / right buttons (◀ ▶) to select desired language. Available languages: English, French, Spanish, German and Portuguese.

Signal Type

Press the left / right buttons (◀ ▶) to select " Air " for antenna or " Cable " for cable.

Auto Channel Search (For antenna or basic cable only)

Press the up / down buttons (\blacktriangle \blacktriangledown) to highlight " Auto Channel Search " and press **ENTER**.



Picture Menu

Accessing the picture menu:

Press **MENU**.

Press the right arrow ▶ to highlight "Picture"

Press **ENTER**.

Press ▲ ▼ to highlight desired setting or submenu.



Picture Settings (submenu)



Press **ENTER** to enter the picture settings submenu.

Press the right arrow ▶ to select from preset picture settings: Standard, Movie, User, and Dynamic.

In "User mode" you can manually adjust brightness, contrast, color, tint, and sharpness.

Screen Size

Press the right arrow ▶ to select a different screen size.

Color Temperature

Press the right arrow ▶ to select a different color temperature.

Advanced Picture Settings (submenu)



Press the right arrow ▶ to turn on/off or modify an advanced picture setting.

Sound menu

Accessing the sound menu:

Press **MENU**.

Press the right arrow ▶ to highlight "Sound".

Press ENTER.

Press ▲ ▼ to highlight desired setting or submenu.



Sound Settings (submenu)



Press **ENTER** to enter the sound settings submenu.

Press the right arrow ► to select from preset sound modes: Standard, Soft,

User, and Dynamic.

In "User" mode you can manually adjust bass, treble, and balance.

Surround Mode

Press the right arrow ▶ to check / uncheck surround mode. This feature creates surround sound from a standard stereo signal.

AVL

Press the right arrow ▶ to check / uncheck auto volume control.

Analog Sound

Press the right arrow ▶ to select a sound type: Stereo, Mono, or SAP (only available in TV mode).

Digital Sound

Press the right arrow ► to select DTV audio language type: English, French, or Spanish (DTV channels only).

Equalizer Settings

Press the right arrow ▶ to enter equalizer settings.

Channel Menu

Accessing the channel menu:

Press **MENU**.

Press the right arrow ▶ to highlight "Channel".

Press ENTER.

Press ▲ ▼ to highlight desired setting or submenu.



Channel List

Press the right arrow ▶ to display channel list.

Favorite List

Press the right arrow ▶ to display favorites list.

Channel Settings

Press the right arrow ▶ to enter the channel settings submenu.

Signal Type

Press the right arrow ► to switch signal type Air/Cable. (TV only)

Auto Channel Search

Press **ENTER** to initial auto channel search. (TV only)

Parental Menu

The parental menu allows you to block content specific content.

Accessing the parental menu:

Press **MENU**.

Press the right arrow ▶ to highlight "Parental".

Press ENTER.

Press ▲ ▼ to highlight desired setting or submenu.



Lock Parental Control

When accessing the parental control menu via the main menu, you need to enter a password to unlock the submenus. Enter your four-digit password with numeric keys 0-9. NOTE*: The default password is "0000".



For example, if PG-13 is blocked, then R, NC - 17 and X will also be blocked.

Changing Password (submenu)



Enter your current four-digit password with numeric keys 0-9. NOTE*: The default password is "0000".

Enter and reenter a new four-digit password with numeric keys 0-9.

Keypad Lock

Press **ENTER** to lock/unlock the TV's front panel buttons.

Source Lock

Press **ENTER** to lock/unlock the TV's input sources.

Setup Menu

Accessing the setup menu:

Press **MENU**.


Press the right arrow ▶ to highlight "Set Up".

Press ENTER.

Press ▲ ▼ to highlight desired setting or submenu.



Closed Caption (submenu)



Caption Display

Press the right arrow ▶ to turn closed captioning on / off.

Analog Caption Type

Press **◄** ► to select analog closed caption type: CC1, CC2, CC3, CC4, TEXT1, TEXT2, TEXT3, TEXT4.

Digital Caption Type

Press ◀▶ to select digital closed caption type: Service1, Service2, Service3, Service4, Service5, Service6.

Digital CC Preset

Press **◄** ► to select digital closed caption presets: Default or Custom.

Digital CC Style (Submenu)

Press **ENTER** to enter the digital CC submenu.

This submenu allows you to select CC font and color.

Menu Language

Press the right arrow ▶ to change the menu language.

Setup Menu (continued)

Clock (submenu)

Press ▲ ▼ to highlight desired setting or submenu.



Press **ENTER** to enter the clock submenu.

Time Zone

Press the right arrow ▶ to select a time zone. (Eastern, Central, Mountain, Pacific, Alaska, Hawaii, Samoa, and Atlantic).

Auto Clock

Press the right arrow ► to turn auto clock on/off.

This setting automatically synchronizes the TV's time using the DTV signal. (Only available with a digital signal)

Setup Time

Press ▲ ▼ ◀ ▶ to manually adjust time.

Day of Week

Press the right ▶arrow to change day of the week.

Daylight Saving Time

Press **ENTER** to check / uncheck daylight savings time mode.

Others Menu

Accessing the others menu:

Press **MENU**.

Scroll right (▶) to highlight "Others".

Press ENTER.

Press ▲ ▼ to highlight desired setting



Blue Back

Press **ENTER** to check/uncheck. This setting allows you to switch between a blue or black background.

No Signal Power Off

Press **ENTER** to check / uncheck. If checked, this setting automatically turns off the TV if there is no signal for more than 10 minutes. (recommended)

No Operation Power Off

Press **ENTER** to check/uncheck. If checked, this setting automatically turns off the TV if there is no menu activity for more than 10 minutes. (recommended)

All Reset

Press **ENTER** to restore all default settings. *NOTE: You will lose and saved channels.

Troubleshooting

TV won't turn on.

- Make sure AC cord is plugged in.
- · Check the wall outlet with a different device.
- The front button panel may be locked. Try using the remote to turn the TV on.
- Unlock the front button panel (page 20):

TV screen says "No Signal"

- Make sure the peripheral device is turned on.
- Make sure the TV is set to the right input.
- For a basic cable or antenna connection, try running the auto channel search (Page 8)

Black and white picture with a component connection.

• If the picture is black and white, make sure the green, blue, and red component cables are in the correct inputs on the TV and peripheral device. (Green goes in "Y", Blue goes in "Pb", and Red goes in "Pr")

There is no sound, but the picture is fine.

- Press the MUTE button to verify that the set isn't muted.
- With a composite or component connection, verify the left audio cable (white) is plugged into the white terminal and the right audio cable (red) is plugged into the red terminal.
- The sound settings may not be set correctly.
- If the audio source has only one jack or is a mono signal, plug the audio into the white audio jack on the TV.

The TV turns off unexpectedly.

• A power surge may have activated the power protection circuit. Wait 30 seconds before turning the TV on.

Can't select a certain channel.

- The channel may be blocked or not approved in the "Parental" Menu. (pages 19 &20)
- The channel may be unchecked in channel list menu. (Page 18)

A black box appears on the screen.

• Closed captioning may need to be turned off (Page 21).


Problems with an HDMI Connection.
